- Work with large groups of children of various backgrounds, ages, special needs and disabilities to overcome social challenges, develop leadership skills, and foster confidence and self-esteem.
- Teach weekly lessons discussing leadership, positivity, and teamwork.
- Provide written and verbal feedback each week about child's performance to parents after each session.
- Film weekly group sessions and cut and edit the video footage to provide take-home teaching moments for the parents and children.
- Assist with public outings for middle school and high school students.
- Create progress reports every 8 weeks about children's performance, improvement, and tips to help foster further development.

- Train and oversee a team of 10 undergraduate research assistants in 1-year follow-up data collection for two studies involving stress, health and development in adolescents.
  - Lead weekly meetings to discuss scheduling, progress, and protocol updates.
  - Conduct bi-weekly inspections of phone interview protocol. Correct mistakes and discrepancies.
  - To date, have completed forty three 60-90 minute phone interviews and ten 30-minute phone interviews.

Protocol Trainer, May 2015 - present

- Train undergraduate research assistants on 2 hour study protocol which includes: a battery of psychological measures, physiological assessment (galvanic skin response, heart rate, muscle tension), administer a social stressor task (a modified Trier Social Stressor Task or Cyberball), and conduct semi-structured interviews to assess for alcohol use (e.g., AUDIT, TLFB).

- Assist in the data collection for two studies involving stress, health, substance use and development among community-recruited adolescents.
- Recruit participants via flyers, tabling events, and community engagement.
- Conduct initial screening for exclusionary criteria and schedule of participants via telephone.
