Responsibilities:

Assist in conducting three studies concerning adolescent development, social anxiety, alcohol use, marijuana use, emerging adulthood, post-traumatic stress disorder, and decision-making and risk-taking among adults 21 and older:

- Assist lead RA in running participants for 2.5 hour studies, obtaining participant assent and parental consent, observing and recording a Timeline Followback (TLFB) for alcohol and marijuana use as well as a semi-structured clinical interview (SCID-5), and instructing participants on how to complete a video simulated computer task (ASIDE).
- Run participants for a 3-hour study, obtaining participant assent and parental consent,
 administering a Cyberball rejection task and the International Affective Picture System,
 and obtaining time-sensitive salivary samples for analysis.
- Conduct telephone screenings with community participants involving sensitive information (e.g., SCID-5 screening for recent major depressive episodes and lifetime alcohol use disorder; trauma history; recent substance use history), obtain initial participant assent and parental consent, and schedule laboratory visits.
- o Train new lab members on processes and procedures for studies.

- Conduct literature reviews and present findings at lab meetings, often collaborating with fellow research assistants and answering questions related to the designated topic.

- Verbal Fluency, Trail-Making Test, Grooved Pegboard Test, Rey-15, CVLT-II, WATR, WASI) to college students.
- Maintain either a high or low rapport throughout the interviews based on the condition randomly assigned for each participant.
- Trained to take over as team leader for this project before the lab was disbanded due to supervisor relocation.

Psychosocial Influences on Advance Care Planning

- o Conduct face-to-face interviews (approximately 8 hours) with college students about advance care planning, end-of life preferences, and perspectives on aging and death.
- Organize and input data from interviews to analyze the results and compare them to similar datasets obtained from different demographics.
