Currently, courses approved to meet this requirement are PSYC 6630 Series on Psychotherapy Theory, Research, and Practice; PSYC 6060 Group Psychotherapy; PSYC 5590 Diverse Family Systems; and PSYC 6410 Psychopathology and Treatment of Adolescents and Young Adults.									
***	6840/6850 Internship may be enrolled for 1 - 3 credit hours during each of the long semesters (Fall and Spring), depending upon the needs of the student to meet their degree plan credit hours. Summer enrollment is not required for 6950 Internship.									
¥	Graduate school rules require continuous enrollment in 6910 Dissertation during long semesters (Fall semesters and Spring semesters) from first enrollment to filing of the dissertation. A minimum of 9 credits is required; a maximum of 12 credits may be counted towards the degree plan. Most Clinical students take 12 credits.									
<b>Notes:</b>	1. This course pattern does not include information regarding the Qualifying Exam (which must be completed by written examination; prior to proposal of dissertation and admission to candidacy) or regarding the requirement for coverage of Human Development (which can be met either by written examination or by specific useage of elective courses).
