Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

1-Anna Wright Memorial Scholarship (Up to \$1,000)

Description: Clinical Psychology PhD student currently enrolled in practicum

Requirements:

- 1. A Clinical Psychology doctoral student at UNT.
- 2. Demonstrate strong academic performance.
- 3. Meet minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the Department of Psychology in effect at the time of any award.
- 4. Maintain full-time enrollment at the University.
- 5. Currently enrolled in practicum at the UNT Psychology Clinic.
- 6. Maintain a 3.0 GPA.

2-Frank Collins Memorial Scholarship (Up to \$1,000)

Description: Clinical or Counseling PhD student preparing for a research career, preferably in academia

Requirements:

- 1. Recognizes a student preparing for a research career, preferably in academia.
- 2. Meet the minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the Department of Psychology in effect at the time of any award.
- 3. Maintain full-time enrollment at the university (unless you have fewer than twice the number of semester hours required to be full-time remaining in your degree program.
- 4. Currently enrolled in good standing in one of the APA accredited programs. (Clinical, Clinical Health, Counseling).
- 5. This distinction is not necessarily awarded annually; there must be strong evidence of a research career trajectory.

3-Bonney Honor Student in Psychology Award (Up to \$1,000)

Description: For grad students who demonstrate a commitment to community service (e.g., volunteering, advocacy)

Requirements:

- 1. Demonstrate strong academic performance.
- 2. Demonstrate a special commitment to community service through volunteerism and advocacy.
- 3. Must be a current graduate student in the Department of Psychology.

4-Ladenberger Honor Student in Psychology Award (Up to \$1,000)

Description: For grad students with record of outstanding service to the department and/or university

Requirements:

- 1. Demonstrate strong academic performance.
- 2. Demonstrate outstanding service to the department and/or university.
- 3. Must be a current graduate student in the Department of Psychology.

5-Rogers Academic Career Award in Clinical Psychology (RACA-CP)

Description: Clinical Psychology PhD student intending to pursue a tenure-track academic career (with 2+ pubs)

Requirements:

- 1. A Clinical Psychology graduate student intending to pursue a tenure-track academic career.
- 2. Be enrolled as at least a half-time doctoral student in Clinical Psychology at the University.
- 3. Be first author or co-author on at least two (2) publications based on original empirical data

- 4. Possess the minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the Psychology Department in effect at the time of any award.
- 5. Have a minimum graduate-level grade point average in Psychology courses of 3.8 on a 4.0 scale.

6-Rogers Excellence Award in Clinical Psychology (REA-CP)

Description: Clinical Psychology PhD student with an exceptional publication and in need of defraying internship travel; Intended for multiple students, each recipient receives an equal share of the available funds.

Instructions: Forward recommendation to Clinical (Dr. Rogers) for final decision

Requirements:

- 1. First author of a psychology article (theoretical or empirical) written at UNT
- 2. Accepted or published in a paper-format psychology journal with an impact factor > 1.0
- 3. A copy of the published or online published first-authored article. Highlight in the copy where the sample was collected.
- 4. A copy of the published or online published first-authored article. Highlight in the copy where the sample was collected.
- 5. A copy from the journal's official website documenting the journal's impact factor.
- 6. A curriculum vitae (CV)
- 7. An application cover page per instructions

7-Outstanding Dissertation Award (\$200)

Description: For grad students who defended an outstanding dissertation by the time of application

Requirements:

- 1. Recognizes outstanding research accomplishments by graduate students before completion of their degree.
- 2. The dissertation must be defended by the time of application.
- 3. Must be nominated by your faculty advisor.
- 4. A letter of reference from your faculty advisor, which also indicates that they are nominating you for this award.

8-Outstanding Thesis Award (\$150)

Description: For grad students who defended an outstanding thesis by the time of application

- 1. Recognizes outstanding research accomplishments by graduate students before completion of their degree.
- 2. The thesis must be defended by the time of application.
- 3. Must be nominated by your faculty advisor.
- 4. A letter of reference from your faculty advisor, which also indicates that they are nominating you for this award.

9-Advanced: Ray W. Johnson Counseling Psychology Scholarship Fund (\$1,000)

Description: Counseling Psychology PhD student in their 5th year or later (but not on internship) with scholarly activity

Additional notes: Rated by the Counseling Psychology Program

Requirements:

- 1. Advanced doctoral students who show investment in scholarly activity to make timely progress toward completion of requirements for the Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology.
- 2. Successful and timely completion of the expected Ph.D. program requirements by the end of 4th year [documented by the program's annual progress reviews].
- 3. Evidence of scholarship activity beyond degree program requirements.
- 4. Not currently completing the internship requirement.
- 5. Not having completed the program's internship requirement.

10-Advanced Outstanding: Charlotte Friedersdorff-Boyd Memorial Scholarship - Graduate Student Award* (Up to \$1,000)

Description: Outstanding and advanced PhD students (preference given to those w/o funding)

Requirements:

- 1. Must be a current graduate student in the Department of Psychology.
- 2. Must meet the minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the Department in effect at the time of the award.
- 3. Maintain full-time enrollment at the University (unless you have fewer than twice the number of semester hours required to be full time remaining in your degree program.
- 4. Enrolled as a full-time student in the Department of Psychology's Doctoral program at UNT.
- 5. Preference will be given to advanced students who do not have other funding.

11-Advanced: Texas Instruments Scholarship - Graduate Student Award* (Up to \$1,000) Description: For advanced PhD students, with preference given to those without funding **Requirements:**

- 1. Must be a student accepted to or enrolled in a graduate program in the Psychology Department at the University of North Texas.
- 2. Must have a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA on all graduate coursework undertaken at UNT.
- 3. The recipient must maintain full-time student status while receiving scholarship funding.
- 4. The recipient must remain in good academic standing while receiving scholarship funding. Funding may be withdrawn if the recipient is placed on academic probation.
- 5. Preference will be given to advanced students who do not have other funding.

TI Incoming Student Award

Awarding Department: Psychology Department

The applicant must be a student accepted to or enrolled in a graduate program in the Psychology Department at the University of North Texas.

Description: Major: Clinical Psychology, Counseling Psychology, or Behavioral Science.

Meet minimum admission requirements of the graduate programs in Psychology.

Minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA on all graduate coursework undertaken at UNT.

Maintain full-time student status while receiving scholarship funding. This will require the student to enroll in a minimum of nine graduate hours per long semester. The student's advisor will determine summer enrollment.

Maintain good academic standing while receiving scholarship funding. Funding may be withdrawn if the recipient is placed on academic probation.

FAFSA: Required

Selective Service Registration: Required

Recipients will be required to sign a scholarship agreement.

Eligibility: Only students who have not received awards from other sources at UNT will be considered.

*The amount of the scholarship award and the number of awards will be determined annually. May not be awarded every year.
